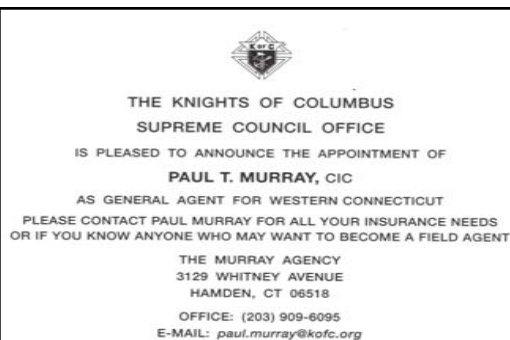

Our Heavenly Mother Mary

Brother Knights,

The story is told of a first grade boy who was trying to impress his classmates by saying: “When I grow up, I’m going to be a lion tamer! I’ll have lots of fierce lions, and I’ll walk into their cage, and they’ll roar!”

He paused for a moment—as he looked at his astonished classmates—and then quickly added: “Of course, I’ll have *my mother* along with me.”

Now this little story certainly reminds us that when a child is faced with a natural danger, he instantly thinks about his mother for help and protection.

All the more so in the spiritual life! Thus, when we the faithful are faced with a spiritual danger, we instantly think about our Heavenly Mother Mary for help and protection. So, we turn to her in prayer, because she is our most powerful intercessor before the throne of Almighty God, one who “never ceases to intercede for our souls.” Mother of Perpetual Help, pray for us!

Finally, here are some ways to have a special veneration* for our most glorious Lady, the Mother of God and ever-virgin Mary: 1) Review the Marian teaching of the Magisterium as given in the *CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH*. 2) Say Marian prayers daily, especially the Rosary. 3) Participate in a Marian devotion, e.g., a novena or prayer service. 4) Make a visit to a Marian shrine, e.g., the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes, Litchfield, CT; the National Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa, Doylestown, PA; the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington, DC; etc.

Associate Member or Insurance Member

When the Knights of Columbus was founded in 1882, it was chartered to serve and provide financial aid and assistance to members and their families. To accomplish this goal, all members were required to own life insurance with the order. Insurance with the Knights saved many widows and children of members from a life of poverty in those early years.

Some years later the Order introduced the notion of “associate membership” for those ineligible for insurance membership. An associate member is one who does not have any insurance products with us. When a man joins the Knights, he becomes an associate member. If he purchases life insurance, an annuity or long-term care insurance on himself, he becomes an insurance member. Buying a policy on his wife or child does not make him an insurance member. Only policies on the member himself make him an insurance member. If a member never takes K of C insurance on himself, he will always remain an associate member.

Life insurance is available on members from age 18-75, on their wives to age 75, and on their children from birth to age 18. Long-term care insurance and annuities are available to age 85. Insurance becomes more expensive as one gets older, and one has to qualify medically, both for life insurance and long-term care insurance. Annuities, however, can be purchased up to age 85 for as little as \$300, without any regard to one’s health.

Every year your council has a membership quota and an insurance quota which must be met to earn certain awards from Supreme. To win the coveted Star Council award, both quotas must be met. The insurance quota is the number of associate members who must become insurance members during the fraternal year. These can be new associate members or veterans. If you are an associate member, and would like to help your council achieve its quota, become an insurance member. If you don’t need or qualify for insurance, invest \$300 or more in an annuity. You can do this with a rollover from an IRA or other retirement plan, or with extra “unqualified” money. In either case your investment will be guaranteed by a top rated company.

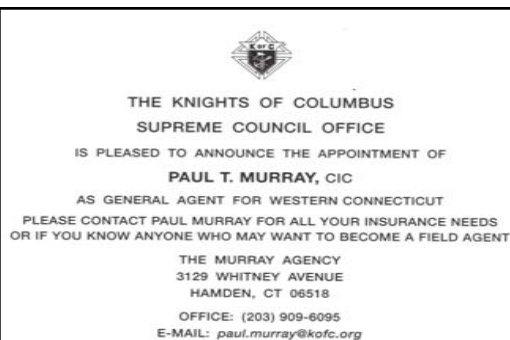
