Chaplain's Corner

Six Timely Tips

Brother Knights,

Consider the following:

- 1) Be sincere, be humble in all that you do for the glory of God, the good of the Church, the salvation of souls, for "What a person is in the eyes of God—that he is, and no more."
- 2) Always work for the unity of a given unit of society, i.e., of a family, a team, an organization, etc. For example, if you incorporate the Family Rosary into the daily schedule of your family, you will gradually observe that "A family that prays together stays together."
- 3) In correcting or counseling another—do so privately, tactfully, calmly, without losing self-control. Make it a spiritual work of mercy!
- 4) In moral matters—consistently choose the objective good, and not an apparent/subjective good. The objective good is that which is in accordance with the Commandments of God and Church and taught by the Magisterium.
- 5) "Always teach—at times by words" meaning Always teach—chiefly by giving good example. Even the Latin adage proclaims: *Verba movent, sed exempla trahunt.*
- 6) Each day read a brief section of the *CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH* (SECOND EDITION). Why? Because the more you know about the precious Catholic Faith, the more you will come to love and appreciate It, the greater benefits you will derive from It, the better prepared you will be to defend It!
