#### Message from the Faithful Navigator Ray Downey

Let me say I believe in the Knights of Columbus and our brothers I am not better than you, please allow me to be as good as you. I joined in 1993 and participated in wonderful events and activities and now am the titular head of Assembly 109- 4th degree by membership vote. The "Special Meeting" called by the Building Board of Directors Association, of which all dues paying Council #41 are members, on August 16th in the Hall was an eye opener to say the least. The letter sent to members mentioned "financial transaction" not a vote to sell the building and property for \$7.25 million. This omission was a mistake as stated by members who knew the truth and felt the Board was hiding the truth. Brother Knights I have spoken with were surprised at our financial situation and asked "What happened to the money we had?" Some said the letter invoked no sense of urgency leaving them to believe there was nothing "Special" about it. As soon as the broker deal was signed, we should have been informed six months ago. "WHY NOT", the marketplace knew and I was told by various members and non-members pieces of information that could have only come from our Board or the marketplace. The concerted effort to withhold information from Council 41 members by the Board was explained away as "We need to make sure we can get the best price, and if bidders on the property know our financial situation it will lower their bids." The vote failed to agree to sell. Well non-members who frequent the bar/lounge told me more information than I knew before the meeting took place on August 16th. They said members of the board told them things. I brought those comments to board members. The failure of the Board to share more information to the membership earlier and fully answer pertinent questions boggles the mind! Imagine non-members drinking at the bar lobbying me on how I should vote. At the same time, I was told by Board members not to discuss anything I knew with our membership! You may recall that as Faithful Navigator I sent emails to our Assembly 109 membership telling them that the Special Meeting was a plan to sell the building and property. One Board member sent me an email telling I had no right to email my Assembly about the truth, his email contained grammatical errors and was a futile attempt to pressure me to not inform you of their intent.

The failure of the Board to adequately inform the membership in the past has led us to where we are today. We need to observe the By-Laws which call for elections every year of five (5) members. The elections have NOT been held for over two years. As per the By-Laws all ten (10) positions are overdue for elections. This has been stated by former Board members who have resigned this year. We need new ideas, thoughts, programs and revenue plans to cover expenses and encourage our membership to continue to support our efforts as they have in the past. This can and must be done. Where do we start? The GK Tom Finn and myself FN Ray Downey, spoke with the Board President Sam Faugno about a Special Meeting for elections to be held at the next Board meeting Sept. 12th. He gave permission after I formally requested as the By-Laws allow him to do, (verbally and by email). Days later he back-tracked and withdrew his permission-even though he had directed me to tell the GK to have the appropriate Board members send out letters as required in the By-Laws to the membership with ten (10) days advance notice of the meeting. The Board member refused and so did the Board President. After continued discussions with Council 41 members and officers and the GK, I have started a list of (thirty-five) 35 signatures calling for a Special Meeting to elect new officers to the Board. This is correct and stated in the By-Laws, it was recommended to have a slate of members willing to volunteer to bring us forward and achieve open communication with the members of the "Association". With the goal of making open and upfront discussions on our future and implement plans beneficial to us all, I have called upon tried-and-true professional men willing to bring these new ideas and move forward openly. Please call me at 203-253-5601 and sign the request and support these men willing to correctly communicate effectively and often about what is happening within the organization. Each month we will evaluate and report the status of this organization. Decisions on our future should not be private. Although we have rituals that non-members do not know, WE ARE NOT A SECRET SOCIETY THAT SHOULD WITHHOLD INFORMATION FROM OUR MEMBERSHIP. As I stated at the August 16th meeting "Knowledge is Power" when used appropriately and for the common good then I would call that correct. Sadly, this information has not been shared which led to the failure of the Board's goal to sell. It was defeated 56-25, but the amendment to renovate the Hall was approved. We must continue to support our caterer and Lounge. Again, I am asking the membership to sign the request for a Special Meeting to be held this September 2022 for new elections to the Board. This is allowed under the By-Laws, (By the way all members may request the current By-Laws from the Board representatives, as stated in the By-Laws.) We have had great members of the Board in the past and there are still some good people today, but we need a fresh start. I understand the difficulties regarding decisions that were made, but accountability is required. Those that agree and feel they can help are encouraged to support no matter the vote. In a new election. The goal is to join together and do what is proper while including the membership as a team. To empower our Association and look forward to the future we must join together and continually exemplify our pillars of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism. Hopefully this message will awaken passionate emotions in all of us. Everyone who spoke with me after the meeting offered encouragement and ideas of support to help us. May I repeat the message of a Captain in WW2 of the US Navy. When he


